

## (3) Voyage to the Heart of the Amazon (6 Nights) A True Expedition Cruise

Description: Voyage to the Heart of the Amazon is different from all other cruises offered in the entire Amazon. It is a true "expedition cruise". We go far, far into the forest and are able to see creatures that are hidden to other visitors. We explore some of the most untouched rainforest in all of the Amazon. The voyage begins in Manaus, Brasil, and the Motor Yacht Tucano navigates far up the Rio Negro [pronounced NAY-GRO]. In the daytime, and often at night, we seek out the wildlife that still lives in the world's greatest wilderness. There are very few settlers so the plants and animals are still abundant.

Voyages on the *M*/Y *Tucano* are quite active with four or five excursions off the vessel every day. Together with our naturalist guides we get out into the forest and explore----not simply watch from the deck of the vessel. There are daily walks in the forest and we scout the small streams that branch off the main river using our electric powered launches or optionally by kayak. Some days we swim off deserted beaches in water as refreshing as rainwater. We are always treated to vistas of wild rainforest stretching as far as the eye can see.

On our excursions into the rainforest we observe magnificent plants of every imaginable shape and size. We listen to the exotic calls of birds and mammals and watch them from a forest trail or while scouting the river's edge in our launches. In the evenings we have a brief discussion about the creatures that we observed and the extraordinary ways in which the plants and animals have evolved to live in this ancient rainforest. Some nights we explore the river's edge in our launches and with spotlights we see caiman, close relatives of crocodiles.

Our basic navigation plan is to explore upstream northwest on the Rio Negro, as far as a major river called the *Rio Jaueperi*, about 200 miles from Manaus, Brasil. Along the way we explore many small tributaries where the forest is wild and undisturbed. Our journey

takes us to many different rainforest habitats which allows us to see a great diversity of wildlife.

On the last day of the voyage we travel to the "Encontro das Aguas", the meeting of the waters of the world's two largest rivers: The Amazon River and the Rio Negro. The light colored water of the Amazon and the dark water of the Negro do not readily mix and the two rivers flow side by side for many miles.

#### **UNESCO Natural World Heritage Site**

Voyage to the Heart of the Amazon explores some of the most untouched rainforest in all of the Amazon. The M/Y Tucano is the only vessel that explores far into the

world's largest Amazon reserve and the only expedition cruise in a UNESCO Natural World Heritage Site: The Central Amazon Conservation Complex. This reserve is the largest in the Amazon with six million hectares of uninhabited wilderness. Roaming these trackless forests are all of the creatures that have made the Amazon the object of myth and legend. Along the Rio Negro there are only a few small settlements large enough to be considered towns. It remains a true wilderness. http://whc. unesco.org/en/list/998

This cruise is the quintessential and truly superlative expedition cruise of the wilderness Amazon. We explore beyond the tangle of vines and limbs along the river banks and experience the primal forest where the forces that shape plant and animal evolution continue on as they have for millions of years.

#### Itinerary Sketch - 6 Nights The Rio Negro

Please note that our cruises are exploratory and we adapt the vessel course to maintain an interesting cruise. But this does not diminish the cruise, instead it allows us to improvise and seek interesting places to explore.

The Amazon River

Day 1 Early this morning all guests board the vessel the *Motor Yacht Tucano* and depart upstream on the Rio Negro. Through the morning we will cruise through the world's largest river island system, the Anavilhanas Archipelago. From the observation deck we scan the magnificent tangle of vegetation at the water's edge. By mid-afternoon the vessel has gone beyond the frontier of settlement and entered a wilderness area. Both shores are covered by dense rainforest. Though we cannot predict what we will see, we likely observe pink river dolphins, primates and a large collection of exotic birds. Most certainly we will be treated to magnificent forest vistas and the spectacular trees themselves. In the late afternoon we embark in the launches and hunt for wildlife. We may also go for a swim in some of the world's most clean and refreshing water. (LD)

Day 2 Early this morning we divide into small groups and explore the rainforest in our launches or kayaks, each group with a naturalist guide. We should hear and perhaps see howler monkeys accompanied by a morning serenade of toucans. After breakfast we go for a walk in the forest where we will get a good start on understanding Amazon ecology. Around midday we return for lunch and the vessel will get underway, perhaps stopping at a place to swim.

In the late afternoon we will again explore the forest in our launches and listen to the sunset chorus of birds, frogs and howler monkeys. (BLD)

Day 3 This morning there will be an early exploration of the waking forest. We will keep our eyes open for sloths... on most trips

we see them often. We return for breakfast followed by either a walk in the forest or an excursion in the launches. The M/Y Tucano will travel during the middle of the day and we stop in the afternoon for an excursion. Tonight the vessel may travel a bit more as we marvel at the night sky crowded with stars. (BLD)

Day 4 After our morning excursions The *M/Y Tucano* will navigate along the heavily forested shore, scouting for wildlife. We may stop for a visit at a settler's home carved out of the forest. In the early afternoon we will be near an extraordinary river called the Rio Jaueperi. Here we will see a kind of forest known as the *varzea*. We will scout along the shoreline for some of the extraordinary creatures found only in this unique environment. This is often a good place to fish for the legendary scourge of the Amazon, Piranhas, which might just become hors d'oeuvres. Weather permitting, we will have a night excursion to observe nocturnal creatures. (BLD)





Day 5 Today we will voyage to the west side of the Rio Negro and continue to scout in our launches and walk in the forest. Weather and water depth permitting, we will explore areas

rarely visited by anyone else. Tonight the *M/Y Tucano* goes downstream, and will enter an east bank affluent of the Rio Negro and explore on deep into the rainforest on this small river. After our nocturnal exploration of the rainforest in our launches we return to the *Motor Yacht Tucano* for "Caipirinha Night" and perhaps try a bit of samba on the top deck. (BLD)

Day 6 We begin the day with a dawn excursion hunting for wakening wildlife followed by a full Brasilian breakfast. We will then go one last

time into the forest. In the mid-afternoon we will begin to journey downstream. We should arrive late in the day at the "Encontro das Aguas" - a stark, several-mile-long line where two of the world's largest rivers, the Amazon and the Rio Negro, join in a turbulent maelstrom. Here the dark water of the Negro runs beside the opaque brown water of the Amazon. At sunset the *M/Y Tucano* will once again turn her bows upstream on the Rio Negro and journey to our overnight anchorage. As we pass in front of Manaus, we will marvel at the scale of one of the world's largest and most vibrant port cities, over a thousand miles from the sea. Tonight we will have a farewell dinner and prepare for an early departure in the morning. (BLD)

Day 7 Early this morning, after a hearty breakfast, all guests disembark from the M/Y Tucano. (B)

#### Meal Codes: B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner

Please note that the day-to-day schedule is approximate. The exact order of the days and specific features may be altered due to navigational and other scheduling considerations.

Degree of Difficulty: Good health is necessary. Guests can have a quite enjoyable trip by simply staying on board the M/Y Tucano and participating in launch excursions. Participants in our walks in the forest must be able to comfortably walk for two or more hours at a time.

## (5) Into the Wild Amazon (4 Nights) The Wild Essence of the Amazon

Description: This expedition cruise endeavors to capture the spirit and essence of the Amazon in a relatively short amount of time. We mostly voyage into the wilderness rainforest on one of the most magnificent rivers in the Amazon basin, *The Rio Negro*. Over three and one half days we walk in the forest, kayak on hidden streams, explore in our launches, and visit local communities along the edges of this wild and largely uninhabited river.

There are three or four excursions off the vessel every day. Early mornings we divide into small groups and glide along quiet channels in our launches or kayaks among giant rainforest trees draped with vines and orchids. The silence is broken only by the rustling of leaves by Squirrel Monkeys feeding or by the occasional piercing shriek of a Screaming Piha bird. During the day we walk in the forest and one day may visit a small riverfront community. Some nights we search for nocturnal creatures in our launches out in the star-filled darkness.

Into the Wild Amazon takes us to a variety of environments including dark flooded forests, the *igapó* and high forest, the *terre firme*, with towering trees and dense undergrowth. On lazy afternoons we may fish for the famous Amazon resident, the Piranha, some of whom we may see again on an appetizer plate. During our voyage we are treated to the ever-changing vistas of travel on the mighty Amazon River itself. Most travelers are astonished by the scale and grandeur of this majestic waterway that drains a continent.

On the cruise **Into the Wild Amazon**, we also experience the culture of the people who live in this vast wilderness. We will visit a small fishing village perched on the river bank where the traditional life is still guided by the rhythms of the rise and fall of the river. We may also visit the homestead of a


family who make and grow almost everything they need. For many travelers these visits with local settlers, whose lives are so dramatically different from ours, are some of the most memorable experiences of the cruise.

Another fascinating visit is at one of the bustling river floating communities. Here a vibrant river trade continues as it has for centuries. The last evening of the cruise we will coast



along one of the greatest ports in the world, the *Porto de Manaus*. At our farewell dinner we will have the opportunity to reflect on our extraordinary experience and offer a toast to one of the most remarkable places on Earth.

## (6) Itinerary: Into the Wild Amazon, (4 Nights)

Day 1 This afternoon we embark on the *Motor Yacht Tucano* in Manaus, Brasil. We depart on the *Rio Negro* and as the vessel glides upstream over lunch we will have our first talk about Amazon environments. By late afternoon we enter one of the world's largest river island systems, the *Anavilhanas Archipelago*. The boat will weave along a winding channel with rainforest on both sides in a riot of brilliant vegetation. Weather permitting, we will go for a launch excursion in the gnarled and dense flooded forest along the river's edge. We may see some Squirrel Monkeys and we may hear the other-worldly growls of Howler Monkeys echoing through the primitive rainforest. The Amazon has one of the greatest collection of birds in the world and we are sure to see some of these brightly colored jewels perched in the treetops.



We return to the *M/Y Tucano* for hors d'oeuvres on the observation deck and a toast to the rainforest sunset. Following dinner we will embark in our launches in search of nocturnal creatures such as the Caiman, the Amazon's crocodilians. We may also see one of the large night birds such as a Great Potoo, with its bulging eyes and large mouth, adapted to swallow the huge Mariposa Moths. (LD)

Day 2 Shortly after sunrise this morning we explore the Anavilhanas Archipelago, a reserve that includes the world's largest system of river islands and also areas of tall dense rainforest. Here we will see the strange environment called the *igapó*, the black water flooded forest, where dense forests grow right out of the dark water of the Rio Negro. Mid-morning we return to the vessel for a hearty Brasilian breakfast. After some time to relax, weather permitting, we will disembark at mid-morning and dividing into very small groups we will go for a walk in the type of rainforest known as the *terra firme*. Here we have a good chance to see the markings, if not the animals themselves, of some of the Amazon's great mammals like peccaries (wild pigs) or even a jaguar.

Around mid-day we return to the vessel for lunch and a siesta. In the afternoon we will excursion in our launches along the edges of the dense forest and listen to the sunset chorus of birds, howler monkeys, and frogs. Weather permitting, tonight we will have an excursion to



spot caiman (the Amazon's crocodiles) and other nocturnal creatures. We very often see arboreal porcupines or sloths scrambling high in the limbs. (BLD)

Day 3 Today we will voyage to the west side of the Rio Negro and continue to scout in our launches and walk in the forest. We will explore, according to the weather and water depth, areas rarely visited by anyone else. Tonight the *M/Y Tucano* goes downstream, and river depth permitting, will enter an east bank affluent of the Rio Negro and explore on deep into the rainforest on this small river. After our nocturnal exploration of the rainforest in our launches we return to the *Motor Yacht Tucano* for "Caipirinha Night" and perhaps try a bit of samba on the top deck. (BLD) Day 4 We begin the day with a dawn excursion hunting for wakening wildlife followed by a full Brasilian breakfast. We will then go one last time into the forest. In the mid-afternoon we will begin to journey downstream to arrive late in the day at the "Encontro das Aguas" - a stark several mile long line where two of the world's largest rivers, the Amazon and the Rio Negro, join in a turbulent maelstrom. Here the dark water of the Negro runs beside the opaque brown water of the Amazon. At sunset the *M/Y Tucano* will once again turn her bows upstream on the Rio Negro and journey to our overnight anchorage. As we pass in front of Manaus, we will marvel at the scale of one of the world's largest and most vibrant port cities over a thousand miles from the sea. Tonight we will have a farewell dinner and prepare for an early departure in the morning. (BLD)

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Please note that the day-to-day schedule is approximate. The exact order of the days and specific features may be altered due to navigational and other scheduling considerations.

Degree of Difficulty: Good health is necessary. Guests can have a quite enjoyable trip by simply staying on board the M/Y Tucano and participating in launch excursions. Participants in our walks in the forest must be able to comfortably walk for two or more hours at a time.

# 0 Brave New Tucano! Nimble, Smart, Stylish, and Elegant, the Amazon Expedition Small Ship

## New Spaces to Enjoy the Rainforest

The *M*/ *Y Tucano* has been substantially renovated. The staterooms were completely redone as was the main salon. And all of the expedition cruise activities were re-imagined to enable travelers themselves to choose how they will be exploring the depths of the Amazon rainforest.

We have made the exploration experience still more comfortable and elegant by thoroughly upgrading the accommodations and public spaces. There were countless small improvements to help the vessel stay new and inviting.



One of the most pleasurable of innovations are the glass panels in the salon that make the M/Y Tucano larger, brighter, and more stylish. Creating the glass walls presented a considerable engineering puzzle. We wanted to avoid turning the salon into an aquarium-style enclosure that would insulate the travelers from the rainforest; an enclosed space would not fit the vessel's commitment to sustainability.

The solution was a system of glass panels that actually open and glide into hidden pockets. Now, at certain times of day, the walls of the salon are opened and travelers enjoy the flower-scented breezes of the Amazon as well as experiencing an immediacy with the rainforest that cannot be had in a enclosed space. When the day becomes hot or we experience one of the magnificent torrential storms of the rainforest, we simply close the glass walls and enjoy the ever changing rainforest tableau in air-conditioned comfort.



## Elegant and Sophisticated

In order to enhance the feeling of elegance, the staterooms on the M/Y *Tucano* were fully refinished and redecorated. The decorative style is of a sophisticated yacht with polished brass and highly varnished wood panels, and this ambience was renewed with new fixtures and refinishing.

Many new artworks were commissioned for the vessel. To amplify

the sense of style as well as to pamper the explorers, the stateroom amenities were also refashioned. The *M/Y Tucano* now features 700 thread count Egyptian cotton woven by Brasil's premier luxury manufacturer, *Artelassê*. Each stateroom also has a bit of France via shower kits by *L'Occitane*.

Finally, the most important renovation made in our project of renewal was the re-imagining of the *expedition cruise* experience. The many daily excursions into the rainforest were thoroughly reviewed and revised in order to satisfy the great range of interests that travelers bring to these expedition cruises. The *M/Y Tucano* has a commitment to enabling travelers to choose among different ways to experience the wilderness rainforest.

In the program re-imagining, these options were expanded so that travelers themselves can choose a leisurely expedition pace with the keen observations of our naturalist guides, or alternatively, they can venture out with our deep forest guides on rigorous fullon nature excursions of deep forest hikes or kayak explorations in remote rainforest streams. With many options to choose from, travelers can themselves actively engage in finding the most enjoyable, meaningful, and authentic way to enjoy the wonders of the greatest wilderness on earth.


## Deck Plans: The Motor Yacht Tucano

Our trips are quite active. We spend much of our time off the vessel exploring the forest, but when we are on board, the *M/Y Tucano* offers space to comfortably spread out and contemplate the wonders of nature. With over seventy large windows, the vessel is bright and airy. Most of the windows open and have screens, so travelers can enjoy the blossom scented air of the rainforest. The staterooms and the salon are air-conditioned and have elegant raised wood panelling so that the adventurers can travel in style. In the deck plans below this symbol:






On this deck there is only one stateroom, number  $\mathbf{O}$ . This stateroom has a queen size bed and a single bed so it can accommodate three travelers. It is a large stateroom, but has a smaller bathroom.




## Middle Deck

## Stateroom Categories

There are three categories of staterooms, all of which are have large windows, private baths with sinks toilets and showers, and airconditioning with individual controls.

Yellow Category: The five staterooms in this category are large and have beds side by side.

Blue Category: These two staterooms are singles, each with a single bed.

Green Category: The two Green staterooms have above and below berths (bunk beds).

## Yellow Category Staterooms

The five double staterooms in this category are large and have beds side by side. They are numbered #3, #4, #5, #6, and #0. Stateroom #0 has a queen-size bed and a single bed. The Yellow Category beds can be converted into queen-sized beds.











## Blue Category (Single Staterooms)

These staterooms, numbers #1 and #8, have a single twin bed. They are smaller than the Yellow staterooms, but have lots of windows and a large bathroom.





## Green Category Staterooms

The double staterooms, #2 and #7, have above and below berths with single size mattresses. They are smaller than the Yellow staterooms, but are comfortable outside staterooms with large windows, private bathrooms, and air-conditioning



## (13) Hotel Nights 2021

We strongly recommend that passengers spend at least one night, but preferably two nights, in Manaus prior to our cruises. Travelers should be rested and eager to embark on their adventure in the greatest wilderness on earth.

## Hotel Juma Opera

The Hotel Juma Opera opened in 2020 and is situated directly beside the *Teatro Amazonas* the famed Opera House of the Amazon. There are 40 spacious rooms many of which overlook the opera house and the stylish plaza the *Largo São Sebastião*. The hotel's public spaces include a dining room and a swimming pool that overlooks the Opera House and the leafy plaza. Breakfast is included. Please note that there may be holiday black-out periods.

Standard Patio View: These 8 rooms vary in size from 260 - 300sf and are situated in the central part of the hotel and have either single or king size beds. Some rooms have connecting doors which can be ideal for families.

Superior Patio View: These 7 rooms vary in size from 345 - 420sf and are in the central part of the hotel. All have king size beds. Premium Theater View: These 15 rooms vary in size from 250 - 300sf and are similar to the Superior Patio View but have a mixture of king or double beds. All these rooms have a view of the Opera House.

There are three categories of rooms which vary in size. All the rooms have king size beds or two twins, are air-conditioned, have complementary Wi-fi, fridges, electronic safes, and french balconies overlooking the central courtyard. The central courtyard has a small swimming pool and the hotel has a fitness center, a business center, and a restaurant. Most of the hotel rooms are Superior Category. - d) GOL Airlines: weekly from Orlando, Florida.


## From Other countries in South America

There are dozens of daily flights to Brasil from other countries in South America which facilitate flight itineraries that include several destinations. The electrical system on board the *M/Y Tucano* is 110 volt / 60 cycle alternating current. In the interests of conservation, in the morning and for a short time in the afternoon, we turn off the diesel generators and all other noise-making machinery which includes the air-conditioning system. A well informed traveler has appropriate expectations and is able to relax and enjoy the experience. Below are some tips on what travelers can expect on our cruises. Be sure that all travelers receive copies of our pre-departure booklet "*Expedition Notes*"! A prepared passenger is happier!

## Are these Luxury Cruises?

Our accommodations are very comfortable and elegant, but we do not aim for luxury accommodations or fine dining. What matters is the sophistication of the narrative, the story we tell, the activities in the forest, and the authenticity of the experience. Our vessel is designed to provide exceptional and extraordinary experiences with very comfortable, but not fancy, accommodations. We cater to a discerning clientele. We strive to offer tour operators and travelers a sophisticated and very elegant ship-board experience and an exceptional field experience at a reasonable price.

#### Is this an active program?

The program is a quite active trip, but is also as relaxing as our guests prefer. Guests can choose! We navigate the *M/Y Tucano* mostly in the middle of the day and at night, which leaves us lots of time to explore off the vessel in the rainforest. For guests who want an active program there are several hours spent exploring every day. We have optional kayak excursions where we thread deep into the flooded forest. For those travelers that prefer a more leisurely but engaged experience, they simply choose from among the many daily excursions. It is an interesting experience just being on the vessel because we are surrounded by wild rainforest.

#### Will travelers see lots and lots of animals?

On our cruises we see lots of *kinds* of animals, because the Amazon has the greatest *diversity* of wildlife on Earth. But we usually see only a small number of creatures of *each* kind. The fantastic collection of creatures of the Amazon is spread out in the forest and the creatures actually *hide from us*. Often a good look at an animal will require binoculars. But these are wild creatures and not the semi-captive animals that are typically found in forest lodges or hotels.

We never know what we will see on a trip, but our cruises generally see many more creatures than other Amazon cruises because of the skill of our guides, the small groups, our wilderness destination, and the fact that we are dedicated to exploration. On our expedition cruise we often see about 100 different species of birds, 3-6 kinds of monkeys, 5-10 different reptiles and amphibians, about 5 or so other types of mammals like anteaters or otters, and a vast collection of some of the most interesting plants on Earth.

## Do travelers get a chance to go into the forest?

Absolutely, we have 3-5 excursions off the vessel every day. This is not a sedentary cruise where guests lounge most of the day, nor is it a cruise focused on fine dining or luxury accommodations. Actually, most of the nature portion of our voyage takes place off the vessel. We go walking in the forest every morning. We have several daily excursions in our launches or kayaks and we visit small villages or the homes of pioneer families. Several nights during the cruise, weather permitting, we also have excursions to observe nocturnal creatures.

## Travelers Choose the Experience!

An important aspect of cruises on the *M/Y Tucano* is that we give travelers choices of the kinds of activities. On the many excursions every day we divide into two groups, each with a different focus. Guests can choose to go with the *Science Group* which goes at a leisurely pace and focuses on the fascinating details of Amazon flora and fauna or, alternatively, they can go with the *Adventure Group* for a longer, much more vigorous exploratory experience hiking or in kayaks. In this way travelers of different interests and expectations can enjoy our activities in the way that they prefer and have the kind of experience that they will enjoy.

#### Are these trips fun?

Of course the trips are fun! Our cruises are aimed at experiencing Amazon nature and the best kind of trip is good-humored, lighthearted, and dedicated to exploration. We try to be precise about nature and we enjoy ourselves at the same time. Weather and navigation permitting, we swim off pristine beaches. We also fish for piranha and sometimes they end up on our table. There is a cocktail hour on the top deck with *hors d'oeuvres* every evening and sometime during the trip we will have "*caipirinhas*", the famous drink of Brasil, accompanied perhaps by a bit of samba, or maybe even some dancing of the Amazon sizzling favorite, the *forró*.



#### When is the best time to go?

The best time to travel to the Amazon is really dependent on a traveler's personal considerations. The key to observing wildlife is not when you travel, but rather the diligence of the guides and the guests, and a little bit of luck. We operate our expeditions all year round and the trips are wonderful any time of year.

Our trips take place in the very middle of the Amazon in the State of Amazonas, Brasil. It rains much less in the center of the Amazon than it does in the Peruvian end...as much as 30% less. The rainy season runs roughly from late January through early May. Though it can rain more in the rainy season, it is rare to have a full day of rain. There are even some advantages to traveling in this season. Most riverine plants fruit and flower in this period, and it is generally a bit cooler.

The dry / low water season runs from September to November and in this period the rivers begin to shallow and broad beaches of fine white sand appear. It often rains a bit in the afternoon in the dry season too. This is an excellent time to see large fishing birds, marine mammals, and at night, reptiles like Caiman, the Amazon's crocodiles. The months of October and November are drier and hotter and correspond to the lowest river levels of the year. Though some creatures will be less abundant in the dry season, others will fly or swim in to fill the void. We usually adapt the itinerary in these months to navigate the changing river channels and the broad beaches that appear at every turn of the rivers.

The *M/Y Tucano* mostly travels in the middle of the day and at night, which leaves the best hours to explore. But when we do travel, when practical, the vessel hugs the shore line and it is interesting to observe the nearby forest. We are constantly on the lookout for creatures which frequently congregate at the river's edge. Though we remain comfortable, we do not become insulated from the forest. The river is fascinating to watch since we often see large fish leaping, pink dolphins, countless birds, and strange gargantuan trees with hanging vines.

We began operating ecological tours in the Brasilian Amazon in 1989, though we have worked in the Amazon since 1982. Our programs are the most intensive and thoughtful offered in the entire Amazon. ## (21) Sustainability

The *M*/Y *Tucano* conducts the most sustainable cruises in the Amazon. There are three parts of our sustainability policy: staffing, tour operations, and ship management.

It's all about the people. On our cruises our staff has a vital role in sustainable tourism. It is not just that they themselves are committed to the environment, and it is not just that they are highly trained professionals, but crucially, they are members of our exploration team for many years. Our staff have long-term employment, not free-lance occasional positions, and in this way the benefits of ecotourism are shared. All of us have a commitment to sharing our knowledge of the rainforest with travelers in a sustainable way.

Tour operations on the *M/Y Tucano* are guided by very detailed "best practices" to protect the flora and fauna as well as help us in our relations with the traditional communities. Because our cruises voyage deep into the wilderness, we encounter rare wildlife and habitats that we are careful to avoid disturbing. All of our excursions off the ship are designed with conservation in mind. Many of our launch excursions are powered by electric motors. We optional have guided kayak excursions most mornings, we fish, we swim, we walk in the forest, and we do our best to enjoy the environment with as little impact as possible.

The *M/Y Tucano* was designed to operate as sustainably as possible and our ship management focuses on energy conservation, pollution control, and waste reduction. Energy consumption is especially important and the vessel has equipment and procedures that help us reduce consumption while at the same time ensuring comfort for our travelers. In order to reduce fuel use and emissions, the *M/Y Tucano* was built with *two* independent water systems: one operated by gravity and one by electricity. The gravity system is not pressurized and the water is heated by solar panels. The powered pressure system heats water with "on-demand" water heaters eliminating the need to heat water 24 hours per day. The power showers are operated at specific times of day.

The *M/Y Tucano* has a policy of "Solar Power Hours" for certain hours during the daytime. When they are not needed, we actually turn off all fuel consuming machines and what energy we use comes from our solar panels. This is generally in the morning and late afternoon when travelers are off the vessel on excursions. The vessel remains comfortable even without electricity because it was designed to offer water and illumination even without diesel generators operating. In Solar Power Hours the sinks, toilets, and the showers continue to function. Because the *M/Y Tucano* has large windows, travelers are able to use natural lighting during the day. All stateroom fixtures have LED lamps.



When it comes to climate control, the *M/Y Tucano* has an efficient air-conditioning system that functions in the heat of the day and at night. Even during the solar power hours, the staterooms stay cool because the vessel is thermally insulated. The stateroom windows open and close and have insect screens. Many travelers choose to entirely turn off the air-conditioning for the duration of the cruise. In ship management we employ hotel sustainability techniques such as changing the stateroom linens every other day instead of every day, unless requested by the travelers. We also avoid the use of disposable packaging, where possible, and recycle our waste in the city of departure, Manaus, Brasil.

Altogether, the combination of specialized equipment, conservation procedures, and responsible tourism practices enable us on the M/Y *Tucano* to operate as sustainably as possible. We do everything we can to not disturb the wild and lovely Amazon wilderness rainforest that we have the privilege of visiting.

We are all in this great mission together.







## Health and Safety Summary

# Maintaining the Zone

To keep our travelers and crew members safe, we have developed procedures that guide every aspect of our cruise operations and shape the passengers' experience. We call it the Tucano Safe Zone. From airport transfers all the way to ship supply, every effort possible is taken to maintain a safe zone for our community. Above all, we consider it our duty to serve as advocates for travelers and staff before, during, and after the journey. Below are summarized some of the measures that we have taken to keep everyone safe and help travelers feel comfortable in exploring with us.

#### Small Groups = Small Contacts

The best possible nature experience is in a small group – and the safest. Normally our cruises are full when we have only 12-14 travelers. In our excursions into the forest, the groups are even smaller, usually less than 6-8 people. This is preserves our zone by keeping the contact pool smaller. Our size also lends itself to Private Voyages so that a family or collection of friends travel in together.

## Departure Lounge and Health Screening

To make sure that all travelers and staff members are healthy, we have built a new departure / arrival lounge for health screening prior to embarkation, the *Tucano Rendezvous*. The screening includes a health questionnaire, an interview, and also verification of vaccination. All staff members and travelers need to provide proof of vaccination prior to boarding the vessel. Baggage is cleaned and sterilized prior to transport to the vessel. The *Tucano Rendezvous* also serves as comfortable for our exploration community and is available at the end of the cruise for travelers to relax prior to outbound flights. Stay in the zone!

## Supply Security

Fundamental to maintaining the safe zone is strict monitoring of people and materials entering the *M/Y Tucano* and the *Tucano Rendezvous*. Everyone that wishes to enter our safe zone, whether they be engine mechanics or cruise travelers, must undergo a health screening. Equally important is that all material goods such as foodstuffs and parts and supplies are sterilized remotely before delivery to the zone. Our strict ship access procedures ensure that the cruises remain contamination free.

## **Ground Transfers**

Embarkation and disembarkation transfers are effected by our own staff in vehicles that are sterilized with electrostatic fogging devices. We choreograph the arrival of people and goods to eliminate waiting and to ensure efficient boarding. Though optional, we strongly encourage that airport transfers be conducted by our trained staff in commercial sterilized vehicles. This way we can be sure that the most complete health precautions have been taken.

## Housekeeping

Protocols for the sterilization

of our vessel, arrival / departure lounge, and all of the equipment are adapted from the recommendations of the World Health Organization, the Latin America Travel Association, and the Cruise Lines Industry of America. Our very detailed checklists and verification procedures stipulate multiple daily cleaning of accommodations spaces and constant sterilization of high touch surfaces. All the fabric components including mattresses and curtains are electrostatically sterilized. Crew quarters and utility areas of the vessel undergo the same cleaning procedures.

**Emergency Planning:** The *M/Y* Tucano has emergency response plans in the event that a cruise participant were to become ill. Pre-established relationships with medical facilities and personnel ensure that timely and appropriate medical assistance is available when needed. Evacuation contingencies are elaborated and contacts kept current. In the event that self-quarantine were to be necessary, vessel cabin space is identified and procedures for caring for ill travelers while preserving vessel health are outlined. Should self-quarantine be necessary in the city of Manaus, we have full apartments available along with plans for providing a safe meal service, continuous assistance, and health monitoring.

*Traveler Advocacy:* At all times Amazon Nature Tours is prepared to assist travelers and advocate for their health and well being while they are in the Amazon. This extends to verifying with hotel operators that health and safety best practices are followed.

**Staffing and Training:** The most important of measures in implementing our safe zone is our staff. All of the marine and land-based crew members are diligent, highly trained, and have a commitment to assisting travelers. Many of our mariners have worked with us for more than 20 years. An ongoing training effort reminds us all of the fine details necessary to maintain our safe zone

**Private Voyages:** These full boat cruises enable friends and family members join in an Amazon cruise exclusively for their group. This is a thrilling way to experience the Amazon and for some travelers adds additional confidence in travelling. The trip can still further be enhanced when services in the city such as airport transfers and city tours are conducted by our company. This ensures that travelers are always accompanied by guides and staff that take maximum care to provide a healthy experience.
